Tuna (Both Yellowfin and Bluefin), Yellowtail and a Dorado are showing in the counts every day. The Yellowfin Tuna are getting respectable with fish in the 20 to 35-pound range and the Bluefin are very catchable with fish anywhere from 30 to 70 pounds being the norm. There are still some of the larger models swimming around, so you never know. With the continued strong influx of tropical weather pushing up from the south, I would think that the fishing will remain consistent through the fall months.

Local Island and even inshore areas are great as well. There seems to be good numbers of quality Yellowtail and Bass being caught all over the place.

Our next trip, the 2 ½ Day aboard the Fortune should be a good one. With the way the fishing has been, we may get a shot at both Offshore and Island fishing on the trip. I certainly hope so...

The October Fortune 2 ½ Day and the November Pacific Dawn 1 ½ Day Trips both have limited availability so don't hesitate or you might get left out. Remember, Valid US Passports are always required on trips leaving the San Diego Ports.

We have a new speaker for the October Meeting. Matt from Madame Lures will be showing his line of soft swimbaits which I have personally used and like a whole lot. I've caught some very nice Ling Cod on those swimbaits.

### **Pacific Dawn Trip Report – By Marty Levy**

We boarded the boat around 7:30 PM. Since the water was to be rough outside, we stayed at the bait receiver until about 2 AM and then headed out. We had decided to go South to target school sized, yellowfin tuna rather than go after the hit and miss bluefin. We started fishing around 6:00 AM and after a little while we ran into a huge school of yellowfin. The boat limited out around 8:30 AM. We then decided to go about 20 miles to an area where bluefin were being caught. We searched around but couldn't get anything to bite. Our plan was to stay around the area and try to catch an evening bite. However, the forecast was for the winds to pick up and for the water to get rough, so we decided to call it a day and get back to the dock Sunday evening

rather than sit in the rough water until the morning. Unfortunately, we had a few mishaps on this trip. **Rex** tripped over a tackle box that was placed by the rod racks and bruised himself and more importantly spilled his glass of wine. **Daniel Domonoske** fainted (we think sea sickness) but recovered well and fished later on, **Bob Reeder** put a hook through his thumb instead of a bait, pulled it out (ouch!) and continued to fish and **Dan Keck** slipped on some tuna laying on the deck, took a hard fall and really hurt his back and was unable to fish for the rest of the day.

The fish averaged 15-20 pounds with first place going to **Jim Padilla** with 21.15 pounds and second place going to **Rob Provost** with 20.85 pounds. Everyone went home with five yellowfin.
